## **State House Happenings**



Governor Christie vetoes tax increases, signs \$32.5 billion budget with reduced pension payments

Using his veto pen to strike down tax hikes and \$1.57 billion in pension payments, Governor Chris Christie today signed a \$32.5 billion budget that is 1.2 percent smaller than last year's spending plan.

In a battle that has centered around the funding of the state's pension system, the Democratic-controlled Legislature passed a budget that included \$2.25 billion in pension payments funded by tax increases on businesses and the wealthy. As promised, Governor Christie vetoed the Democrats' proposed tax increases, and slashed the state's pension contributions to \$681 million.

It is expected that the Governor's budget will be challenged in court by New Jersey's public workers unions, who contend the reduced payments violate a 2011 law requiring adequate funding of the state's pension system. Superior Court Judge Mary Jacobsen recently ruled in favor of the Governor's move to slash contributions for Fiscal Year 2014, citing the emergency nature of the state's fiscal crisis. However, Judge Jacobsen also stated that she expects the unions to return to court for the FY 15 budget, and she may order the state to make a higher payment to the pension system.
